In 2019-2020 Bert sailed solo, non-stop around the world using only a sextant, compass, and a single table for navigation. He is the 9th person to complete such a

but no mean feat considering he grew up in southeastern Saskatchewan!

As a small boy, Bert's father taught him to sail. Easy enough here on the west coast,

Since then, he has sailed on the IjsselMeer in Holland, the North Sea, and six of the seven world oceans. He's sailed the coasts of California, Mexico, British Columbia, and Alaska, and into the Bering Sea, to the Aleutian Islands, to Kodiak Island, and through

Including his solo circumnavigation, Bert has sailed more than 46,000 nautical miles most of which has been in the world's harshest, most extreme marine environment on


